WHEREAS, The Board of Commissioners have the obligation and duty to protect the best interests of the citizens, residents, and visitors in Hanson County, South Dakota; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of public safety, health, and welfare of the residents and citizens of Hanson County, SD; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that the county provide guidance and regulations for the welfare, safety and protection of visitors within the county;

WHEREAS, SDCL 7-18-21 specifically authorized the County to regulate temporary campgrounds; and

WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest of the taxpayers and residents of Hanson County to regulate temporary campgrounds and the establishment and use thereof; now, therefore,

It was moved by McManus, and seconded by Letcher, that the following Ordinance be adopted:

ordinance #13

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR TEMPORARY CAMPGROUNDS AND ASSEMBLIES OF PEOPLE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Hanson County, South Dakota, that:

- 1. <u>Purpose.</u> It is the purpose of this ordinance to regulate temporary campgrounds of 20 or more occupants and to regulate assemblies of people in large numbers in excess of those meeting the health, sanitary, fire, police, transportation and utility service normally provided in order that the health, safety and welfare of all persons in the county, residents and visitors alike, may be protected.
- 2. <u>Jurisdiction</u>. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to or within municipalities. This ordinance shall not apply to regularly established permanent places of worship, government sponsored fairs, rodeos, farm sales, auctions, or assemblies licensed under other laws.
- 3. <u>Definitions</u>. Unless specifically defined, words or phrases used in this ordinance shall be interpreted so as to give them the meaning they have in common usage and to give this ordinance its most reasonable application:
 - A. ASSEMBLY means a company or group of persons

gathered together any location at any single time for any purpose.

- B. PERSON means any individual natural human being, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, firm, company, association, society or group.
- C. TEMPORARY CAMPGOUND means an area for camping, for up to two weeks in a year, and occupied by twenty (20) people or more. Campgrounds licensed by the State of South Dakota who are providing tent space for temporary occupation **shall be** required to obtain a county permit.

4. Permit Required.

- A. Permits. [1] No person shall permit, maintain, conduct, advertise, act as an entrepreneur, undertake, organize, manage, or sell or give tickets to any actual or reasonably anticipated assembly or temporary campground area whether on public or private property, unless a permit has first been issued by the coordinator, application for which must be made at least thirty (30) days in advance of the assembly or a temporary campground area.
- [2] A separate permit shall be required for each location of a temporary campground and/or assembly and the fee shall e as follows:

- [3] A permit shall only allow the maximum number of people stated in the permit. The person holding the permit shall not allow, nor sell tickets to more than the maximum permissible number of people.
- B. Requirements For Permit. Before any person may be issued a permit the applicant shall first:
- [1] Determine the maximum number of people which will be admitted to the location.
- [2] Provide proof that the applicant will furnish, at his own expense, before the assembly commences or the temporary

campground is open to the public:

- [a] Potable water, meeting all federal and state requirements for purity, sufficient to provide drinking water for the maximum number of people allowed at the rate of one (1) gallon per person per day, and water for washing at the rate of two (2) gallons per day per person.
- [b] Separate enclosed toilets, one unit for under twenty-five (25) occupants, meeting all state specifications and requirements, conveniently located throughout the grounds, together with an efficient sanitary means of disposing of waste matter deposited, which is in compliance with all state rules and regulations.
- [c] A sanitary method of disposing of sold waste, in compliance with state laws, rules and regulations, together with a plan for holding and a plan for collecting all such waste at least once each day the assembly or temporary campground is in operation, and sufficient trash cans with tight fitting lids and personnel to perform the task.
 - [d] A parking area for assembly sufficient to provide parking space for the maximum number of people at the rate of at least one (1) parking space for every four (4) persons. This area is to be located inside the grounds.
 - [e]. Tent space inside the grounds sufficient to provide individual tent spaces for the maximum number of people at the rate of four hundred (400) square feet per person.
 - [f] Security guards sufficient to provide adequate security for the maximum number of people at the rate of at least one (1) security guard for every two hundred (200) people, to be paid for by the person(s) running the assemblage. Campgrounds shall have a responsible person on duty at all times.
 - [g] Fire protection, including extinguishing devices and fire lanes and escapes, sufficient to meet all state and local standards.
 - 1/ No open fire shall be permitted except in facilities provided and approved when within a fire protection district.
 - 2/ No open fires shall be left unattended.
 - 3/ No fuel shall be used and no material burned which emits dense smoke or objectionable odors.
 - 4/ If fires are permitted the owner must make available fuel suitable for the facilities provided.

- [h] Barbecue pits, fireplaces and incinerators shall be located, constructed, maintained and used so as to minimize fire hazard and smoke nuisance both on the property on which it is used and on neighboring property.
- [i] Garbage and rubbish storage and disposal shall be handled in such a manner so as not to create a health hazard, rodent garbage, insect breeding areas, accident or fire hazards, or air pollution. Containers shall be provided in sufficient numbers and capacity to properly store all refuse. All refuse shall be collected daily.
- [j] Condition of grounds.
 - 1/ The condition of the soil, ground water level, drainage and topography shall not create hazards for adjoining property or endanger the health or safety of the occupants.
 - 2/ The grounds shall be kept free of rubbish, trash, or debris which could become a safety hazard.
- [k] Soil and ground cover requirements.
 1/ The growth of brush, weeds and grass shall be controlled.
 2/ All areas shall be maintained to prevent the growth of ragweed, poison ivy, poison oak, poison sumac and other noxious weeds considered detrimental to health.

5. Application for Permit.

- A. Application for a permit shall be made in writing to the Hanson County Auditor's Office at least thirty (30) days in advance of an assembly or a temporary campground.
- B. The application shall contain a statement made upon oath or affirmation that the statements contained therein are true and correct to the best knowledge of the applicant and shall be signed and sworn to or affirmed by the individual, natural human being, by all officers in the case of a corporation, by all partners in the case of a partnership or by all officers of an unincorporated association, limited liability company, society or group, or, if there by no officer, by all members of such association, society or group.
- C. The application shall contain and disclose:
 - [1] The name, age, residence and mailing address of all persons required to sign the application as above provided and, in the case of a corporation, a certified copy of the articles of incorporation together with the name, age,

residence and mailing address of each person holding ten per cent (10%) or more of the stock of said corporation.

- [2] The address and legal description of all property upon which the assembly and/or temporary campground is to be held together with the name, residence and mailing address of the record owner(s) of all such property.
- [3] Proof of ownership of all property upon which the assembly and/or temporary campground is to be held or a statement made upon oath or affirmation by the record owner(s) of all such property that the applicant has permission to use such property for the purpose(s) so stated in the application.
- [4] The nature or purpose of the assembly and/or temporary campground.
- [5] The total number of days and/or hours during which the assembly and/or temporary campground is to last.
- [6] The maximum number of persons which the applicant shall permit, not to exceed the maximum number which can assemble and/or camp within the boundaries of the property as stated in the application.
- [7] Plans for supplying potable water including the source, amount available and location of outlets.
- [8] The plans for providing toilet and lavatory facilities including the source, number and location, type and the means of disposing of waste deposited.
- [9] The plans for holding, collecting and disposing of solid waste material.
- [10] The plans, if any, to illuminate the location of the assembly, including the source and amount of power and the location of lamps.
- [11] The plans for points of highway access.
- [12] The plans for security including the number of guards, name, age, and address, their deployment and hours of availability.
- [13] The plans for fire protection including the number, type and location of all protective devices including extinguishers and the number of emergency fire personnel available to operate the equipment.

- [14] The plans for sound control and sound amplification, if any, including number, location and power of amplifiers and speakers.
- [15] The plans for food concessions and concessionaires who will be allowed to operate on the grounds including the names and address of all concessionaires and their license or permit numbers.

6. Processing Application.

- A. The application for a permit shall be processed within thirty (30) days following receipt thereof by the Hanson County Auditor's Office and shall be issued by the Hanson County Board of Commissioners if all conditions are complied with.
- B. If the application is denied by the Hanson County Board of Commissioners, the applicant shall have the right to apply to the Board of County Commissioners.
- Revocation of permit. The permit may be revoked by the Hanson County Commissioners at any time if any of the conditions necessary for the issuing the permit or contained in the permit are not complied with, or if any condition previously met ceased to be complied with. Any such revocation may be made by the Hanson County Commissioners without notice or hearing, if the Commissioners determine that an emergency exists and that it is not practical, in relationship with its obligation to protect the public health, morals and welfare, to allow the permit to proceed. In any such case, however, the owners of the permit may, within a period of three (3) days from and after revocation, apply or petition the Commissioners for an administrative hearing to show why the revocation should not be set aside and the permit reinstated.
- 8. Adequate Insurance. Any person applying for a permit hereunder shall have adequate special events insurance to cover the risks associated herewith, and to protect the participating public.
- 9. Requirement To Meet Other Requirements. Any person applying for a permit hereunder shall be required to meet the requirements of and to comply with the requirements of all applicable state and federal laws and regulations.
- 10. Hold Harmless Provision. Any person or organization applying for a permit hereunder shall hold Hanson County harmless from civil liability arising from any item which is granted a permit hereunder.

- 11. Public Protection Plans. Each application for a permit shall include a plan to provide for adequate protection in the following areas, based upon the numbers of people anticipated to be involved:
 - A. fire suppression;
 - B. first aid services;
 - C. ambulance services;
 - D. security;
 - E. crowd control;
 - F. sanitation; and
 - G. traffic control.
- 12. Enforcement. Injunction Proceedings to Prevent or Abate Violations. The holding of an assembly or a temporary campground in violation or threatened violation of the regulations or restrictions of this ordinance shall be deemed a public nuisance. The Board of County Commissioners or any member thereof, in addition to any other remedies available, may institute an appropriate action or proceeding to seek an injunction in a court of competent jurisdiction to prevent, restrain, correct or abate any such violation or threatened violation, and it is the duty of the State's Attorney to institute such action.
- 13. <u>Violation</u>. Each calendar date that a person or organization is in violation of this ordinance shall constitute a separate violation thereof.
- 14. Penalty. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance may be punished by being fined in an amount not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars or incarcerated in jail for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- 15. Severability Provision. If any provision of this ordinance is declare unconstitutional or the applicability thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the constitutionality of the remainder of the ordinance and applicability thereof to others persons and circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

SDCL 44:02:03:35 Temporary Campgrounds - Water Supply Temporary campgrounds may not use a portable water source which is not in accordance with minimum drinking water standards, Chapter 74:04:05. If a water-hauling transport is used, its storage tank or tanks must be constructed of an impervious

material that is watertight and can be easily sanitized. Each tank load of water must be chlorinated at the filling location to provide at least three parts per million available chlorine. All water-hauling transports must keep a daily log indicating the amount of disinfectant added and the amount of water for each tank load.
